INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE USE OF THIS PASSPORT

1. All participants will carry this Passport as identification as an entrant in the 1995 THREE FLAGS Classic.
2. Participants will present this Passport in person to the checkpoint personnel at ALL SIX (6) CHECKPOINTS AND AT THE FINISH. This Passport will be validated at each of the checkpoints and at the Finish with the checkpoint stamp, the day, time and date and the signature of one of the checkpoint officials.
3. This Passport, with validations from all checkpoints within the prescribed time limits, will indicate a successful finisher and will entitle the participant to the finisher's awards (a brass belt buckle, an embroidered patch and a commemorative pin).
4. This Passport becomes the participant's souvenir at the completion of the 1995 THREE FLAGS Classic. IT CANNOT BE REPLACED.
5. Holders of this Passport must travel the entire route by motorcycle, sidecar or trike, as either driver and/or passenger. All vehicles must travel under their own power and may not be towed, pushed or carried.

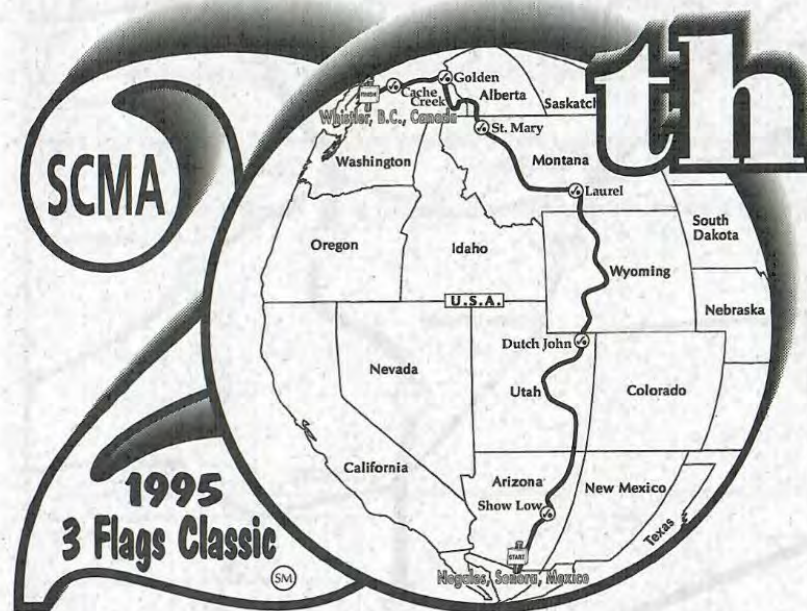

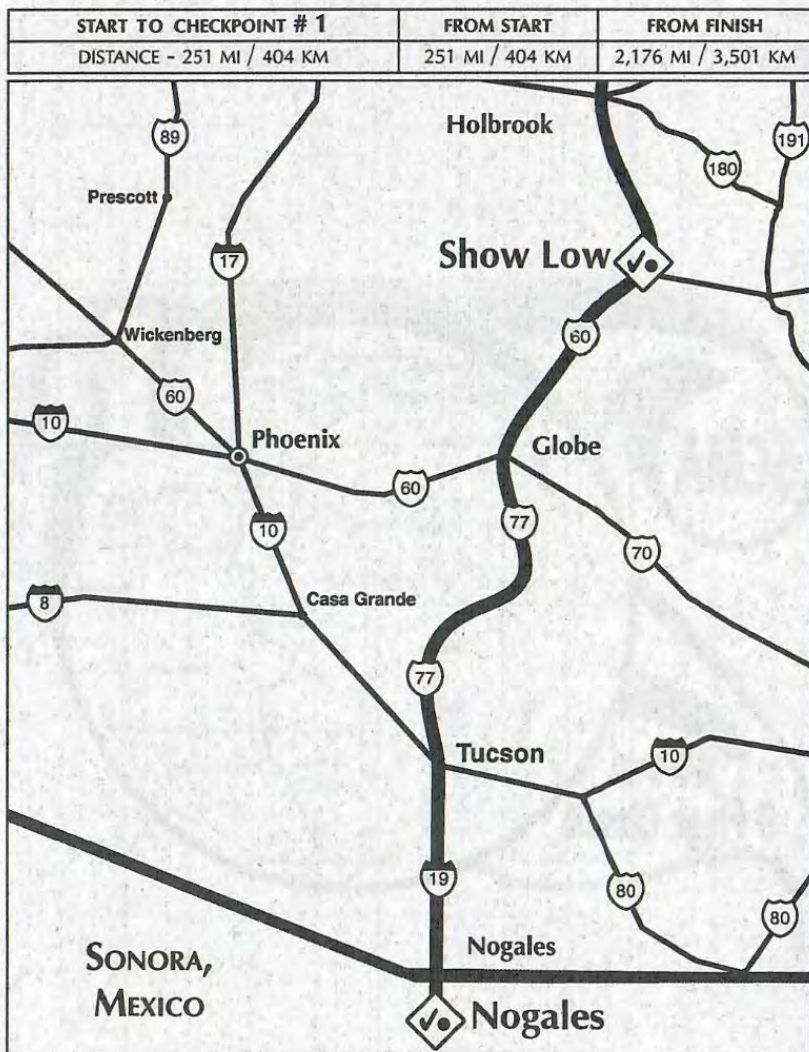

DESCRIPTION OF ROUTE TO CHECKPOINT No. 1:

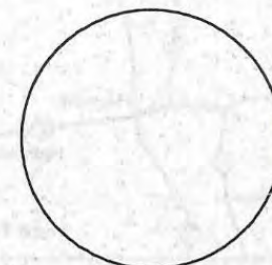
This first segment of the Classic will take you from Nogales, Sonora, Mexico to Tucson, Arizona. This is a very arid area crossed quickly by interstate.

From Tucson, you will continue north on Highway 77 traversing the Salt River Valley climbing sharply on winding curves towards Globe and Miami, noted mining towns.

This route maintains a high elevation through Apache Indian country, descending into fertile farmlands.

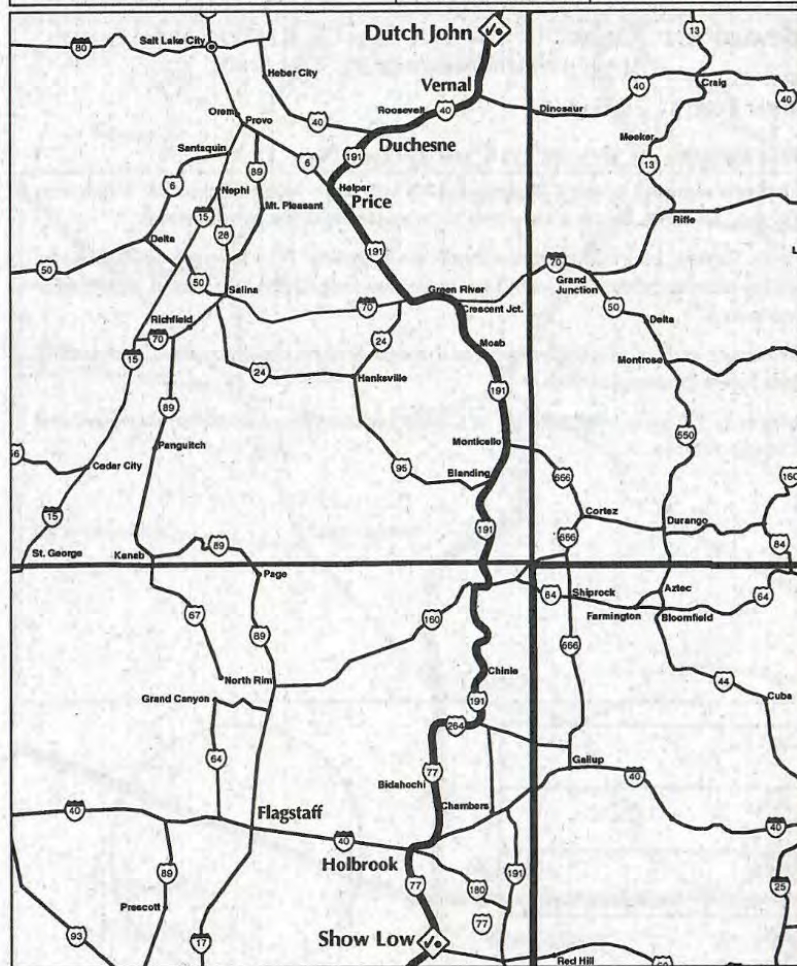
Highway 77 joins Highway 60 at Globe and continues north to Showlow and Checkpoint No. 1.

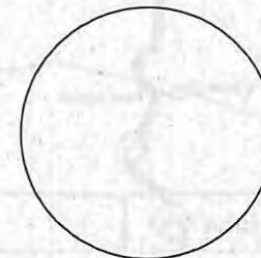

DESCRIPTION OF ROUTE TO CHECKPOINT No. 2:

From Showlow, Arizona you will travel a mountainous route with sections of scrub brush and pine wooded slopes. Passing through Holbrook continuing on Highway 77, you will cross the renowned Painted Desert to Indian Wells to Highway 15 across to Highway 191 where you will pass through the Canyon de Chelly National Monument area.

Next, you will enter the high desert crossing into cattle range territory with spectacular views of mountains, canyons, plateaus and rivers continuing through Vernal to Checkpoint No. 2 at Dutch John, Utah.

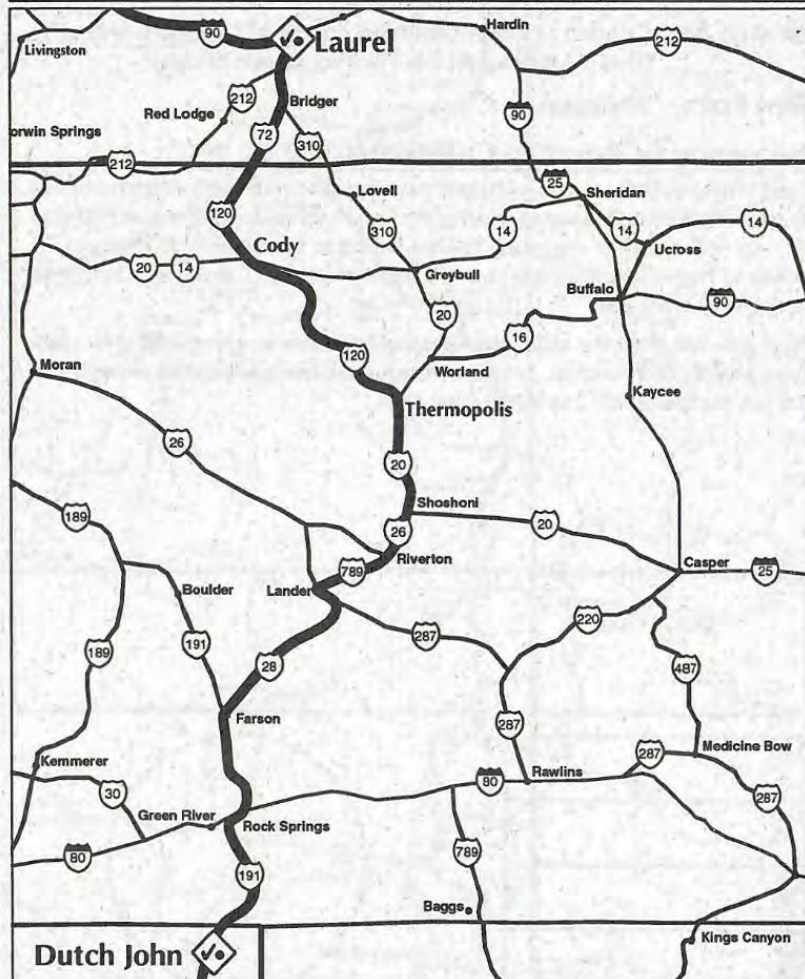

DESCRIPTION OF ROUTE TO CHECKPOINT No. 3:

Continuing north on Highway 191 from Dutch John, Utah, you will follow a winding course across stream-fed fertile valleys and scenic mountains. It is the gateway to the picturesque Flaming Gorge.

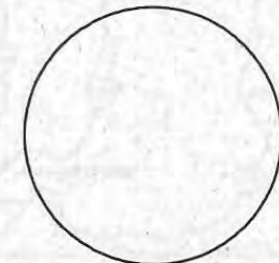
Continuing northbound on Highway 28, you will soon be crossing the Continental Divide through the South Pass to Lander, Highway 789 to Riverton, then Highway 26 to Shoshoni, Wyoming.

This route maintains a high elevation on gently rolling range lands and crosses the Wind River Indian Reservation of the Shoshoni Indian tribe.

From here it's Highway 20 to Thermopolis and onto Highway 120 North toward the town named after Col. Buffalo Bill Cody in 1898. Cody, Wyoming serves as the east entrance to the great Yellowstone National Park where the animals that roamed the lands are still free to do so today.

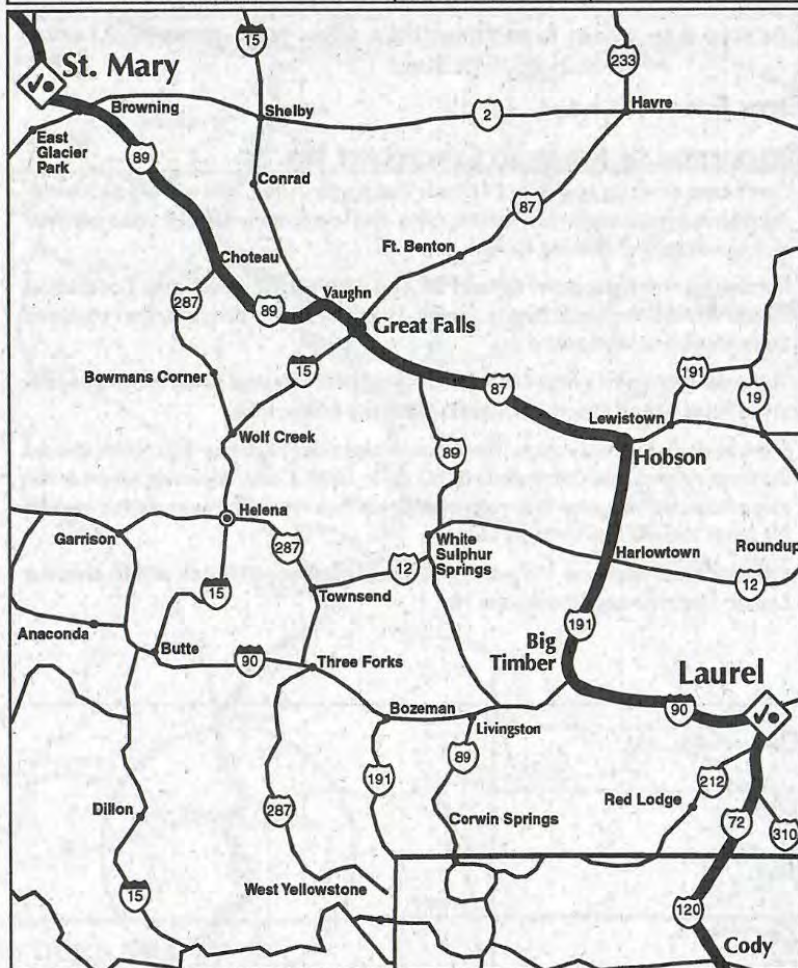
Continuing on Highway 120, which becomes Highway 310, you will be entering Laurel, Montana and Checkpoint No. 3.

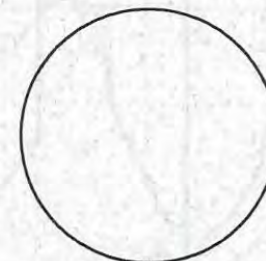
DESCRIPTION OF ROUTE TO CHECKPOINT No. 4:

You will now traverse Interstate 90 West to Big Timber. This is the only interstate you will travel during the Three Flags Classic. Interstate 90 parallels the Yellowstone River through a narrow valley bordered by mountain ranges.

Highway 191 North will be the next highway toward the finish and then Highway 87 West to Great Falls, Montana. Once again, you will glide over rolling range lands with views of mountains off in the horizon. This area is home to huge cattle ranches.

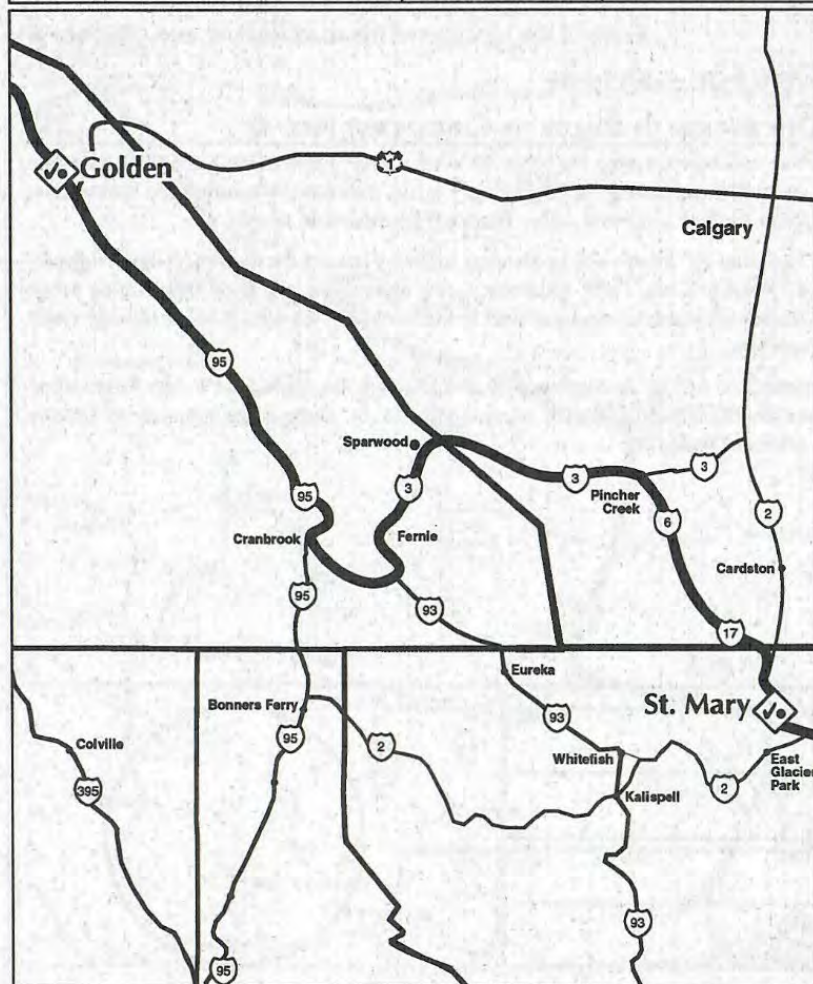
Soon you will be on Highway 89 and crossing the Black Foot Indian Reservation to Checkpoint No. 4 in St. Mary, Montana. St. Mary is the gateway to Glacier National Park.

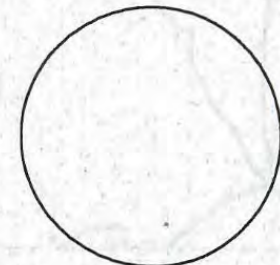
From St. Mary, Highway 17 will take you towards the Canadian border where it becomes Highway 6 and you will pass through the edge of Waterton Glacier Park and over Highway 3, the Crowsnest Highway.

Once more you will cross the great Continental Divide passing through the MacDonald Range with its canyons, mines and small communities to Highway 93 North to Golden, British Columbia.

Now, you will find densely wooded slopes and foothills that parallel several small rivers and fertile valleys. These are noted for their fruit orchards and livestock.

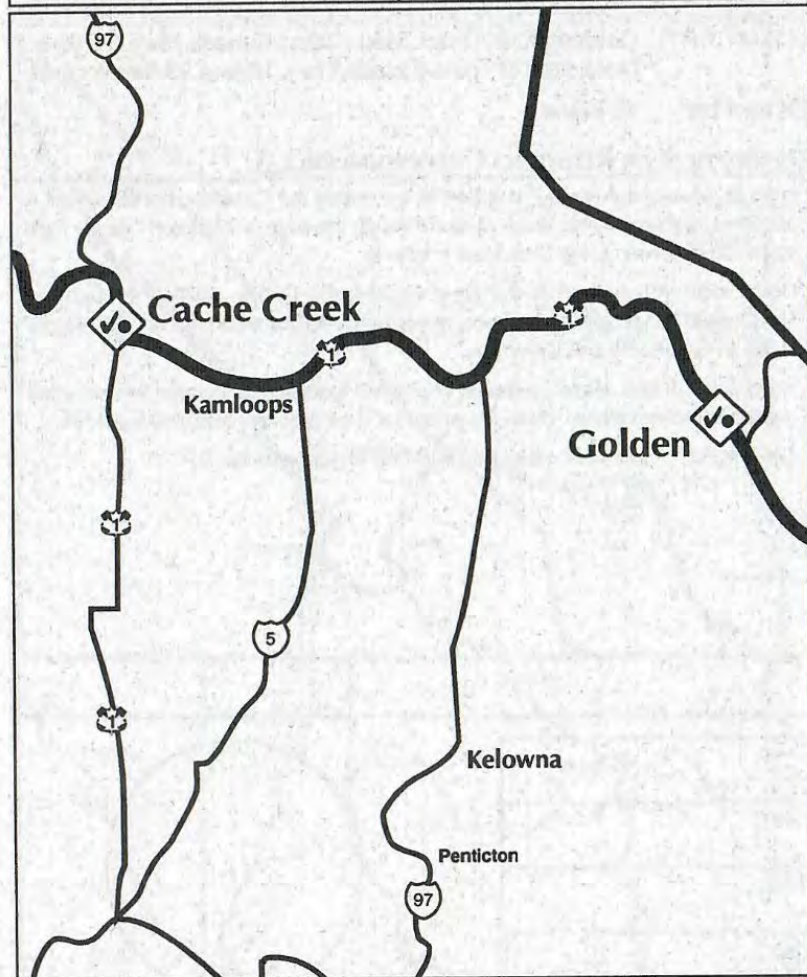

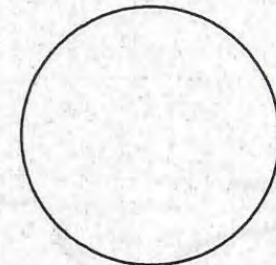

Next is Rogers Pass, another of Canada's great landscapes, which will lead you to Kamloops, a two-time finish location of the Classic in prior years.

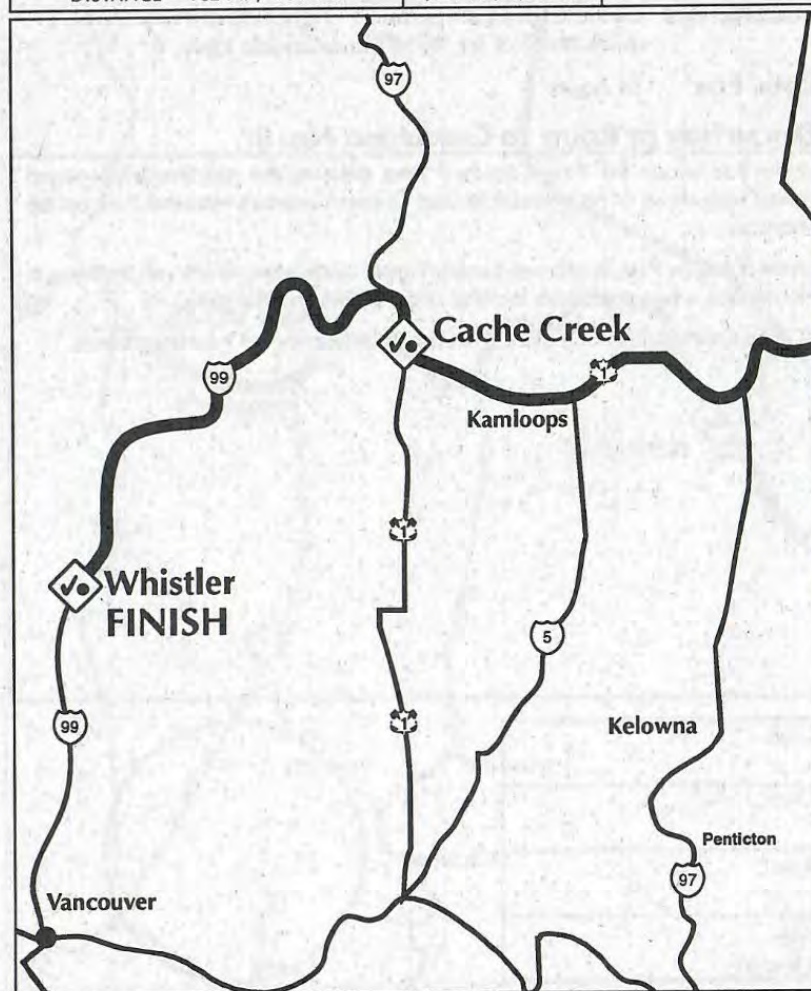

As you leave Cache Creek heading north on Hwy. 97 and Hwy. 99 S.W., you'll reach Lillooet, a small picturesque mining community nestled amongst the tall trees.

Continuing on Hwy. 99, you will twist your way toward Pemberton, home of a pot-bellied pig that lives in the general store. This is an extremely pretty area with the Lillooet River running alongside the road for miles and miles. This is pure heaven through here - a camera is a must!

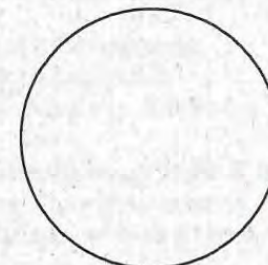
After Pemberton you are in the home stretch to the finish and will now be descending into the No. 1 ski resort in North America, Whistler, B.C.. On your left will be the breathtaking view of Blackcomb Mountain off in the distance.

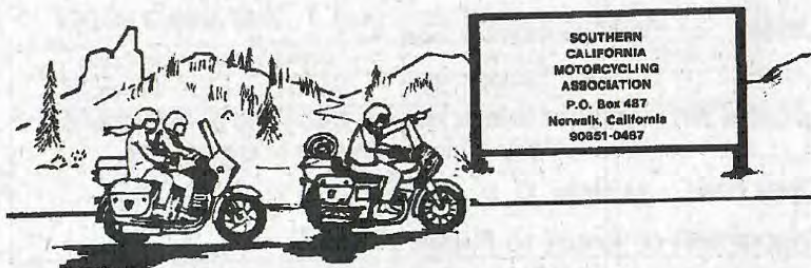
Whistler hosts a variety of activities from golfing to bike riding and more. The Village offers a number of shops, restaurants and hotels. The coastal mountains of Whistler were a product of a geological fender bender.

Brandywine Falls, just south of Whistler, were formed when the creek spilled over a low ridge of lava carving a canyon 60 meters below the crest of the falls.
